Tuberculosis (TB) remains one of the leading infectious diseases worldwide. India contributes highest share in tuberculosis disease burden globally. The Government of India had taken a series of steps towards its aim to eliminate Tuberculosis by year 2025. Social determinants including environmental exposures play crucial role in Tuberculosis epidemiology and thus prevention and control. Air Pollution is an important risk factor for disease burden globally and in India too. Hence. It is imperative to understand linkages between air pollution and tuberculosis transmission. And role of air quality management in prevention and control of tuberculosis in the country. This webinar aimed to discuss current evidence of linkages of air pollution exposure and tuberculosis transmission, and opportunities for air quality management in tuberculosis prevention and control.
